2024 Australian Strongman Alliance Invitational

WHEN: 10AM-6PM ON AUGUST 11

Watch as some of Australia's top strong men and women take on five gruelling events in an Australian Strongman Alliance competition. The first event will be the Axle Overhead Anyhow where competitors will have three attempts to lift the heaviest axle (50mm diameter barbell) over their heads. This is followed by the Strongman Cornhole where competitors will throw five 10kg sandbags approximately eight metres into a giant cornhole board or over a crossbar for additional points. The third event, aptly named the Truck Tyre Deadlift, features competitors trying to deadlift the heaviest three repetitions they can manage. Rounding out the afternoon will be Event 4: Farmers Walk (competitors race 15 metres up and 15 metres back) and Event 5: Atlas Stones, where six of the large said stones must be hoisted over a one metre crossbar as fast as they can. Each of the five events will run for approximately 45 minutes, with break interspersed with displays to get the crowd involved.

This is just the second time the Ekka has hosted the only Queensland qualifier for one of the biggest events internationally, the 2024 Magnus Ver Magnusson Strongman Classic, held in Iceland later this year.

Back by popular demand, the Beaut Utes come in all shapes and sizes, so this competition features several classes - Street, BnS, 4x4 and Novelty. Prizes will be awarded in each class. The utes from clubs including OutKast Ute Club and Dukes Utes will also be on display beside the Large Animal Pavilion from 9am to 1pm.

RAAF Roulettes

Ekka entertainment will go sky high this year with the return of the Roulettes, the Royal Australian Air Force's aerobatic display team.

Marvel as these aeronautical acrobats fly as close as three metres apart, showcasing the level of visual judgement and hand-eye coordination that pilots in the Air Force are able to achieve. These skills are an extension of the formation, aerobatics, low level flying and airmanship skills taught to all Air Force pilots during training that are then developed throughout their career.

The Ekka Roulette displays will consist of up to 6 Pilatus PC-21 aircraft performing a number of manoeuvres flown in various formations at low level, sometimes as low as 80 metres, at speeds of up to 370 knots (685km/h), whilst the pilots experience up to six times the force of gravity (6G) during the display.

Trackskill Precision Driving Utes

WHEN: 1PM AUGUST 11, 12:30PM AUGUST 13-18

The Precision Driving Team has always been an Ekka crowd favourite and this year we pay tribute once again to them with a skilful display and drive down memory lane.

Former Ekka Councillor and rally car driver Lloyd Robertson formed the team at the Brisbane Showgrounds for the 1969 Ekka and after 40 successful years, the team disbanded in 2006 with Lloyd retiring.

Re-enacting the iconic Precision Driving Team, four V8s, two Holden and two Ford, will hit the main arena, performing the awe-inspiring driving manoeuvres that were performed by the original team years ago. This includes nose-to-nose driving, handbrake flicks, spins and slides with a time trial challenge between Holden and Ford as the finale.

Taking to the steering wheels behind the powerful engines are some of Australia's leading V8 drivers – Gary Baxter, Michael Baxter, Tim Ramages and Graham Edwards.

As Ekka celebrates the nostalgic traditions of 145 Shows, we are excited to bring precision driving back to where it all began – this is one show to sure stir up childhood memories of the Ekka.

Aussie FMX Motocross

In this zany show, watch as riders wearing jockey silks and rollerblades roll around the arena while mounted on miniature ponies. The rollerblades will do all the heavy lifting as the jockeys vie for first place in this riotous race of miniature proportions.

The sheep industry uses coats for sheep to keep them warm after they have been shorn during the colder months of the year. They are also used in high quality wool production to keep any dirt out of the wool so as to not damage it whist growing on the sheep. On this occasion, the vests will collectively be fitted with more than 3000 LED lights to add to the mustering spectacle.
